

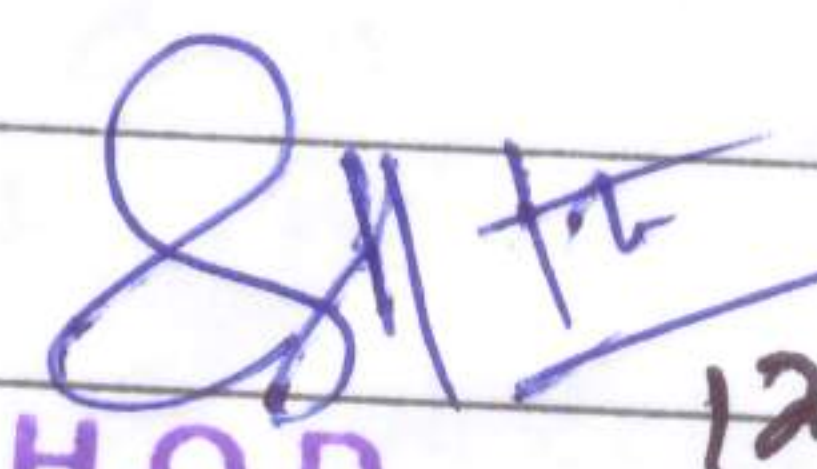

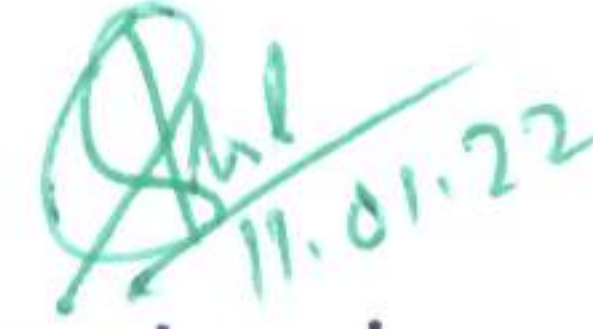

Activity report:-

The Seminar was conducted under the chairmanship of Prof Savat Kumar Mohapatra. Prof Rajansekhar Dasigrahy joined hand as a resource person of the Seminar and presented view on the topic. Other participants kept their views on the topic. Five nos of students presented their papers on the topic.

Abstract of Topic:-

Sometimes Indian Secularism is interpreted by some in a limited and narrow way. They even hold that "India is a godless state" or that India is an "anti-Hindu state". Such critics of Indian Secularism advocate the view that since the people of India, almost all, are firm believers in God. Indian Constitution should have given a due place to this fact in its Preamble.

Some of the critics also argue that while safeguarding the rights of minorities and while providing for state action in matters connected with religion, the Constitution unilaterally gives to the state some powers to "interfere" in "Hindu religious affairs".

The above two views of the Critics are based upon a bigoted thinking. Belief in God is a matter of individual conscience.

Adopting a religion or not adopting a particular religion is matter of conscience, though in practice religion comes to an individual by way of inheritance. A child born in a Hindu family becomes a Hindu and one born in a muslim family becomes a muslim. The Indian State pretends to leave faith in God to the realm of freedom of conscience and stands for a separation of politics from religion. For a multi-religious society like India, it is indeed best for the State to maintain religious neutrality.
